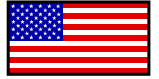

Travel Ministry – The Holy Land – an 12-day Pilgrimage

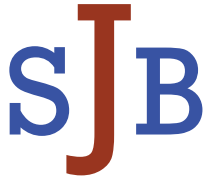
