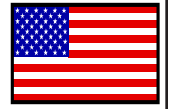

When we are faced with these kinds of situations we are not usually in a position to do a lot of research into what the Church teaches and believes about the topic. Things like; Is it okay to remove feeding tubes, decline or terminate ventilators... We instinctively know that it is a balance between honoring the life that God has granted to us and honoring our loved one's own desires. Now is a good time to start looking into these kinds of things, instead of waiting until it is an emotionally charged time when none of us think very clearly. “Let us all remember this: one cannot proclaim the gospel of Jesus without the tangible witness of one's life. Those who listen to us and observe us must be able to see in our actions what they hear from our lips and so give glory to God.”

In his parable today, Jesus likens the pearl of great price to the reign of God; the parallels would have been clear to his audience. Just as the merchant single-mindedly searched for pearls, so they needed to seek for spiritual treasure, entirely committed to this quest. There is no room for half-heartedness, for timidity, or for holding back: God's great pearl is the prize awaiting those who prove themselves worthy. *Teach us to be seekers and finders, O God, that Your pearl may be ours.* (Excerpts from “Living With Christ,” July 2014)
